Week 1 Lesson 1 Moving to music. Teddy Bear's Picnic

Week 2 Lesson 2 Storytelling with actions. The Sleeping Princess.

Week 3 Lesson 3 Using instruments to represent actions. We're Going on a Bear Hunt.

Week 4 Lesson 4 Musical story composition. Compose and practise their own composition.

Week 5 Lesson 5 Musical story performance. Practise and perform their own composition.

Week 6 Recap/Showcase

Vocabulary- classical music, dynamics, loud, quiet, musical story, lyrics, melody, character, song, tempo, fast, slow, pitch, high, long, instrument names, percussion, compose, composer, composition, perform, performance, audience.

Y1/Y2 Kapow Sound patterns Fairytales

Week 1 Lesson 1 Character voices. Explore and change dynamics using the voice. Three Little Pigs.

Week 2 Lesson 2 Starting with instruments. Using instruments and body percussion to tell the story.

Week 3 Lesson 3 Sound patterns. Reading simple rhythmic patterns.

Week 4 Lesson 4 Responding to music. Using instruments and body percussion to play a rhythm and keep a pulse.

Week 5 Lesson 5 Fairytale performance. Use untuned percussion instruments in a class performance, keeping pulse and rhythm.

Week 6 Recap/Showcase

Vocabulary- dynamics, volume, pitch, voice, character, sound pattern, loud, quiet, soft, fast, slow, rhythm, beat, pulse, syllable, perform, performance, audience.

Y3/4 Kapow Jazz Ragtime Music

Week 1 Lesson 1 – Ragtime. To sing and clap a syncopated rhythm for a ragtime-style song.

Week 2 Lesson 2- Traditional jazz. Improvising a call and response in time with the music.

Week 3 Lesson 3- Scat singing. To be able to scat sing using the call and response format.

Week 4 Lesson 4- Jazz motifs. Writing a jazz motif using a swung rhythm.

Week 5 Lesson 5- Swing rhythms. To adapt a familiar nursery rhyme tune using jazz rhythms.

Week 6 Recap/Showcase

Vocabulary- Jazz, ragtime, rhythm, syncopation, syncopated, call and response, traditional jazz, improvise, scat, motif, swing rhythm, straight quaver, swung quaver, even rhythm, uneven rhythm.

Y5/6 Kapow Baroque

Week 1 Lesson 1– Monteverdi and the invention of opera. Exploring the work of Monteverdi.

Week 2 Lesson 2 – Johann Pachelbel and the canon. Read and play a canon from staff notation.

Week 3 Lesson 3 – Henry Purcell and the ground bass. Understanding baroque music features.

Week 4 Lesson 4 – JS Bach and the fugue. To combine knowledge of staff notation and aural awareness to play a fugue.

Week 5 Lesson 5 – George Frideric Handel and the oratorio. Understanding a fugue structure.
