Dear parents/carers and families,

This week, despite being the week before half term, has been rather action packed! Children celebrated and learnt about online safety for Safer Internet Day on Tuesday. They worked as a class and then on their own to answer questions and establish how to keep themselves safe online, as well as how to become an ethical online citizen. As a mark of their excellent learning children have worked toward an actual, physical online safety licence — which if they have not yet been given by their teacher they will get when we return after half term. The online world is a really tricky one to navigate, especially for families. Please do take a look at the various online safety newsletters we send out — there has been a special edition for Internet Safety day, but we also send out an online safety newsletter each month to keep you all update with new developments. There are some really good resources for helping you talk to your children about many different things and I would highly recommend visiting the National Online Safety website and the Safer Internet Centre websites, for guidance in educating your family.

It has also been Child Mental Health week this week, a national event aimed at raising the profile of child metal health and providing resources to help teach children how to manage their mental health. All classes did some really important learning along the theme of "Let's Connect" as this was the theme for the week. This is linked to the five ways to wellbeing, themes that science has helped us to understand contributes to developing and maintaining sound metal health. These five ways are

This has really enthused and celebrated the children's learning and Longships class were absolutely beside themselves with excitement at the royal visit. They have been asking for a long time about if they can meet the King, after starting their learning after Christmas, and so today was a real high point for them.

After half term we are going to be rolling out something called Parent Pay, which will help with payments and lunch bookings across the school. It will allow you to choose and book your child's school meal with them and have more understanding of the options available to them. It will also eliminate the need for paper invoicing as you will be able to log in and see outstanding balances for lunches and trips, and is an excellent way to enhance communication and processes across the school. Please keep an eye open in the first week back for an email containing your login details to the platform.

Finally, with mental health in mind, can I just wish you all a wonderful half term. Please use the opportunity to connect with friends and family and look after your own mental health. Connecting with those we love is so important, but while we are all feeling the strain of financial burdens, many of us are finding we are working longer hours and are becoming more "time poor", which can't always be helped in our society. I hope that whatever you are doing over the coming week, you can find some time to be together and enjoy!


