<p>Learning outcomes: Plan learning experiences that enable children to ...</p> <p>Talk about the things that they find interesting, puzzling or wonderful and also about their own experiences and feelings about this world.</p> <p>Retell stories, talking about what they say about the world, God , human beings.</p> <p>Think about the wonders of the world, expressing ideas and feelings.</p> <p>Say how and when Christians like to thank their Creator.</p> <p>Talk about what people do to mess up the world and what people do to look after it.</p> <div data-bbox="98 1018 441 1214" style="background-color: #f8d7da; padding: 5px; margin-top: 10px;"> <p><i>Colour key:</i> Making sense Understanding impact Making connections</p> </div>	<p>Learning outcomes</p> <p>Make sense of belief: Retell the story of creation from Genesis 1:1 -2:3 simply. Recognise that Creation is the beginning of the “big story” of the Bible. Say what the story tells Christians about God, Creation and the world.</p> <p>Understand the impact: Give at least one example of what Christians do to say thank you to God for Creation.</p> <p>Make connections: Think, talk and ask questions about living in an amazing world. Give a reason for the ideas they have and the connections they make between the Jewish/Christian Creation story and the world they live in.</p>	<p>Learning outcomes</p> <p>Make sense of belief: Place the concepts of God and Creation on a timeline of the Bible’s “big story”. Make clear links between Genesis 1 and what Christians believe about God and creation. Recognise that the story of “the Fall” in Genesis 3 gives an explanation of why things go wrong in the world.</p> <p>Understand the impact: Describe what Christians do because they believe God is Creator(e.g. follow God, wonder at how amazing God’s creation is, care for the Earth- some specific ways). Describe how and why Christians might pray to God, say sorry and ask for forgiveness.</p> <p>Make connections: Ask questions and suggest answers about what might be important in the Creation story for Christians and for non-Christians living today.</p>	<p>Learning outcomes</p> <p>Make sense of belief: Identify what type of text some Christians say Genesis 1 is and its purpose. Taking account of the context, suggest what Genesis 1 might mean and compare their ideas with ways in which Christians interpret it, showing awareness of different interpretations.</p> <p>Understand the impact: Make clear connections between Genesis 1 and Christian belief about God as Creator. Show understanding of why many Christians find science and faith go together.</p> <p>Make connections: Identify key ideas arising from their study of Genesis 1 and comment on how far these are helpful or inspiring, justifying their response. Weigh up how far the Genesis 1 creation narrative is in conflict or is complementary with a scientific account, giving good reason for their views.</p>
