Week 4 Lesson 4 Musical story composition. Compose and practise their own composition.

Week 5 Lesson 5 Musical story performance. Practise and perform their own composition.

#### Week 6 Recap/Showcase

Vocabulary- classical music, dynamics, loud, quiet, musical story, lyrics, melody, character, song, tempo, fast, slow, pitch, high, long, instrument names, percussion, compose, composer, composition, perform, performance, audience.

# Y1/Y2 Kapow Contrasting dynamics- Space

Week 1 Lesson 1 Vocal soundscape. Create a simple soundscape using dynamic changes.

Week 2 Lesson 2 Creatively responding to music. Listen to music (Mars by Gustav Holst) and respond creatively, considering how dynamics, instruments and mood can be represented through drawing.

Week 3 Lesson 3 Comparing music. Compare two pieces of music by the same composer, using musical vocabulary to explain differences in tempo and dynamics.

Week 4 Lesson 4 Pitch patterns. Create a short pitch pattern to represent a planet and write down the composition.

Week 5 Lesson 5 Creating and performing a musical structure. Perform a pitch pattern representing a planet, using vocal and instrumental sounds and changes in dynamics.

#### Week 6 Recap/Showcase

Vocabulary- dynamics, volume, loud, soft, quiet, silent, force, tempo, speed, fast slow, sound, soundscape, voice, vocal, compose, composer, composition, suite, representation, pitch, pattern, high, low, instrument, tuned, beat, glockenspiel, rehearse, perform, performance, audience.

#### Y3/4 Kapow Adapting and transposing motifs- Romans

Week 1 Lesson 1 Here come the Romans. Sing in tune and in time. Learn the Road Building song.

Week 2 Lesson 2 Musical motifs. Learn what a motif is, and how to identify one, playing and incorporating motifs into the Road Building song.

Week 3 Lesson 3 Motifs and mosaics. Compose and notate a motif.

Week 4 Lesson 4 Motif development. Develop and transpose a musical motif.

Week 5 Lesson 5 Combine and perform. Combine and perform different versions of a musical motif.

### Week 6 Recap/Showcase

Vocabulary- song, call and response, dynamics, volume, loud, soft, quiet, tempo, speed, fast, slow, pitch, high, low, voice, warm-up, lyrics, melody, expression, compose, composer, composition, symphony, pattern, repeating, motif, ostinato, riff, loop, change, develop, instrument, tuned, beat, quaver, half note, minim, crotchet, semibreve, notate, notation, transpose, transposition, sharp, flat, key, rhythm, order, rehearse, perform, performance, audience.

## Y5/6 Kapow South and West Africa

Week 1 Lesson 1 Shosholoza a cappella. Sing a traditional African song unaccompanied.

Week 2 Lesson 2 Playing shosholoza. Use tuned percussion instruments, such as glockenspiels, xylophones or steel pans, to learn the chords for the Shosholoza song.

Week 3 Lesson 3 The Shosholoza show. Use vocals or tuned percussion to perform a piece of music as an ensemble, incorporating learnt African dance steps and chords.

Week 4 Lesson 4 Drumming away to Africa. Practise reciting rhythms with varying dynamics and tempo, before following the pulse set by the 'master drummer' on the traditional West African djembe drum.

Week 5 Lesson 5 Eight beat breaks. Develop more complex rhythms and creating an eight-beat break

to perform as a class.

Week 6 Recap/Showcase
