Dear Parents/carers and families,

Welcome to 2024 and the Spring Term! We are looking forward to an exciting term of learning. As well as computing, art and music weeks, we have two three-week blocks focused on History. The Y1 and Y2 children will be historians, examining evidence to find out about changes in hospitals and healthcare over the last two hundred years, and also about the Great Fire of London. At the same time, the Pebbles will be exploring the topic of "People who help us", looking at how the role and equipment of doctors, nurses and fire fighters has changed over the years. For further information please refer to the Guiding Light Curriculum Longships Year B on the school website under Curriculum/Content and Plans. For Reception children, please also find the EYFS curriculum document on the school website under EYFS/Curriculum. We will be holding Showcase Open Afternoons as last term for you to view and enjoy your child's learning. These are on Wednesday 7th Feb and on Tuesday 26th March at 2pm.

Please remember that school starts promptly at 8.45, when we mark and close the register, so you need to be arriving at the gate well before this time. If you arrive after 8.45, you will need to go around to the front of the school and enter via Reception.

The children will continue to have PE lessons on **Tuesdays** and **Fridays**. Please ensure that your child's PE kit comes into school on a **Monday morning**. If your child does not have their kit in school, we will phone home to ask that it is brought in. Your child will **not** be able to take part in the lesson if they do not have their kit. Please also ensure that they have the correct kit- black or navy blue shorts/joggers and the correct colour t shirt for their Godrevy group. They can wear their school sweatshirt or bring a separate one especially for PE, but it **must** be plain navy blue or black.

It is **really, really important** that you make practising letter sounds and listening to your child read part of your weekday daily routine, however busy you are. **This applies to all children in the class,** whether they are on RWI or Accelerated Reader books. It will take 5, 10 or 15 minutes at most, but the benefits to your child are massive. It is very evident to staff which children are practising regularly and which are not, as it really impacts on their day to day progress. At the end of the week, the children place their superhero on our Empire State Building display. Those who have read on 4, 5, 6, and 7 days will receive the prize of a chocolate button. Please record all the days when you have heard your child read in the diary. The children really love their chocolate button, so please help them achieve at least 4 days of reading practice. Pebbles children will have weekly phonics homework. Y1 and Y2 children have weekly spelling homework set by Mrs Polglase. I will also be adding some extra Maths or English homework for them this term.

Thank you to everyone for signing in to Seesaw. I know that some of you look at the messages daily, but not everyone does this (I can see who has read each post). It is really helpful if you try to look at





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notifications regularly, as it means that I can contact you quickly with class information and updates. It also means that you are aware of what your child has been learning that day in school, so that you can offer interest and support. I will try to put information onto Seesaw as soon after the end of the school day as possible. Especially exciting class news appears on the school Facebook page.

If you have an important message, please contact the office via email or telephone call. Messages about illness and absence should **always** be sent to the office, and not just given verbally to the teacher on gate duty.

A reminder about classroom rules;

- -Please could the children wear the correct school uniform and P.E. kit. P.E.shorts, joggers and sweatshirts should be **black** or **navy blue** and not any other colour.
- -Please could long hair be tied back. Also could elaborate head bands, bows, slides and hair ties be avoided, as they tend to distract children from their work, and end up being constantly taken off and put back on throughout the day.
- -Please could children bring water in their bottles, not squash or juice. Please see me if this is a problem.
- -Please could the children **not** bring toys and personal possessions into school. These are again a distraction and it is upsetting if they get broken or lost. For show and tell sessions, I would like the children to bring in either a favourite story for me to read to the class, or something that is directly linked to our current learning. Otherwise I am overwhelmed with tens of children wanting to show things like small stones that they have picked up!
- -Also, it would be really helpful if you could sort through your child's book bag **each day**, making sure that their reading book, diary, spelling book (Y1/2) and homework folder are in place, and that information letters and any of your child's drawings and craftwork are removed.
