Our focus on the 5 ways to wellbeing and emotional and mental health has allowed us to teach the children ways to find and embrace joyfulness.

Success – All of our children have found that they can be successful in many ways. We do not just focus on the academic, but we look at music, sport, drama, resilience, organisation and responsibility. We have helped the children realise that success is a very individual experience and we are very proud of each and every child here. Every single child at Kehelland school is successful.

Making memories – well what can I say about this one! We have made so many memories this year – school trips, wow and showcase days, the London residential, the residential to Plymouth, the sleepover at school. Concerts, plays, sports days and PTA events. Our curriculum and classrooms is focused on helping the children learn more and remember more, with lots of staff training focused on the science of memory.
